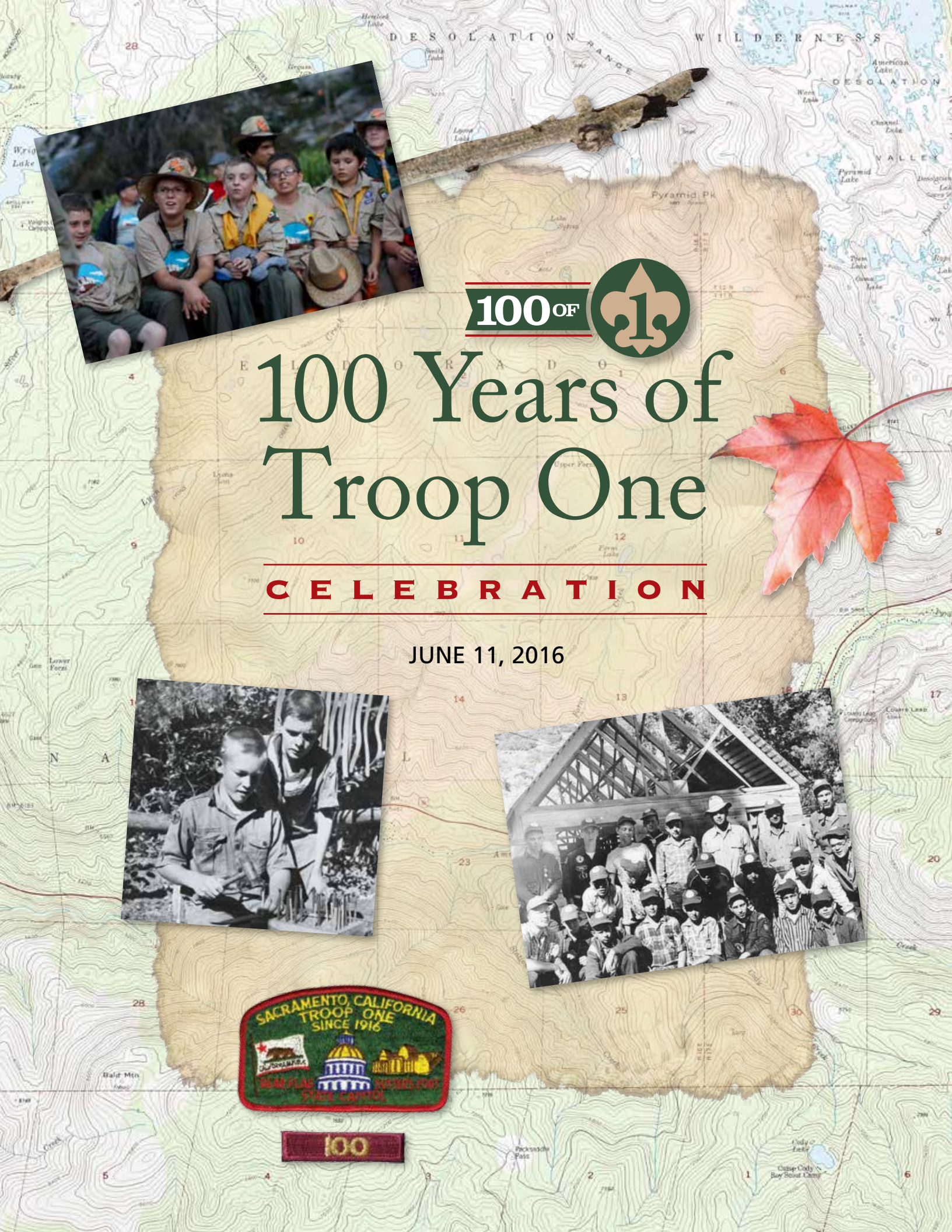

A BRITISH SPY INFLUENCES SACRAMENTO'S BOYS



In 1916, while many Americans warily watched the European war, boys in the small city of Sacramento fell under the influence of a former British military spy.

That spy was Robert Baden-Powell (1857-1941) Scouting's founder. In the 19th Century, while on military duty in Africa, "B-P" travelled through enemy territory, posing as an eccentric butterfly collector. He concealed details of military forts in his field drawings of butterfly wings. This reconnaissance work, or "scouting," led to his desire to introduce British boys to outdoor skills. B-P founded the Brownsea Island Scout Camp in 1907, starting the Scouting movement. Later decorated for his military service and Scouting contributions, we know him as Lord Baden-Powell.

In 1909, a chance encounter between American businessman W.D. Boyce and the "Unknown Scout" on a foggy London street prompted Boyce to learn more about Scouting from Baden-Powell. In 1910, Boyce formed the Boy Scouts of America which eventually consolidated with other youth movements.

According to a history of Troop One written for its 90th anniversary, Scouting first arrived in Sacramento in 1910 when two groups called "companies" were formed with the commitment "to the development of all that is best in the boy." These early Scouts promised "not to lie, steal, curse, drink, smoke or do anything which my father or mother would in any way object." Sacramento's Boy Scout companies continued for another six years. In 1916, a few adults, along with 24 boys from the First Methodist Episcopal Church Sunday school classes, decided to form Troop One which claims that it is the oldest continuing Boy Scout troop west of the Mississippi River. The first Scoutmaster was W. George Spilman.

FACTS ABOUT TROOP ONE OF SACRAMENTO

On the occasion of Troop One's 100th Anniversary, 1916-2016

Widely recognized as the "Oldest Continuously Operating Troop West of the Mississippi."

Over the past 100 years, an estimated 1,700 boys have been members of Troop One.

Over its 100-year history, 41 Scoutmasters have led Troop One.

Many Troop One Scouts are the sons and grandsons of former Troop One Scouts.

Historic Note: The son of Chief Justice Earl Warren was a member of the Troop. Retired Judge Earl Warren, Jr. (Sacramento County Superior Court) is an alumnus of Troop One.

In Troop One's first 100 years, Scouts have earned over 18,000 merit badges and 416 have earned the rank of Eagle Scout, Scouting's highest rank

Over the past 10 years, 177 Scouts have completed:

- 757 rank advancements, including 44 Eagle Scouts (about 25%)
- 2,258 merit badges

Historically, only 5% of all boys nationwide that join Boy Scouts achieve the rank of Eagle Scout. In Troop One, over 20% of its scouts become Eagle Scouts.

Over the past 10 years, 177 Scouts have completed:

- camping nights 8,014
- hiking miles 11,314
- rafting / canoeing miles 2,260
- biking miles 2,161
- service hours 4,880

During the past 10 years, these individual Scouts have been very active:

- Daniel Thweatt completed over 185 nights camping
- Will Roberts and Luke Tileston hiked over 423 and 514 miles, respectively
- Daniel Thweatt completed 122 miles rafting / canoeing
- Sebastian Honigs, Alex Joslyn, and Will Roberts completed over 71 miles of biking
- Gabriel Neal donated 142 service hours

Currently, 93 scouts and 57 adults are registered with Troop One. Over the 100 year history, multiple Troop One adults have served as: Golden Empire Council President, District Chairperson, District Commissioner, and many other Council and District volunteer positions.

Troop One adults are 100% trained (the Capital City District is average is 43% trained).





Troop One adults' recognitions include:

- National Eagle Scout Association Distinguished Eagle: Robert McCurry & Harold McCurry
- National Eagle Scout Association Outstanding Eagle: Scot Crocker & George Morrow
- Multiple Golden Empire Council Silver Beavers and multiple District Silver Bears

To earn their Eagle rank, it is estimated that Troop One Scouts have donated over 50,000 hours of community service for projects in Sacramento and throughout Northern California including:

- Repairs and restorations at the Old City Cemetery in Sacramento
- Repairs and restoration of picnic tables and benches at dozens of Sacramento city and county parks
- Planted over 100 trees at local parks
- Construction of wildlife nesting boxes in Sutter County
- Video history production for Sacred Heart Church (East Sacramento)
- Development of nature trail signage at CSU Sacramento
- Repairs to Sacramento Society for Prevention Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) yard and building
- Painting "Do Not Dump" signage to protect storm drains that flow to rivers
- Landscaping and site improvements at numerous neighborhood elementary, middle and high schools
- Signage and improvements to Bishop Francis Quinn housing center
- Signage and improvements at Christo Rey High School
- Signage and improvements at Loaves and Fishes and its Mustard Seed School
- Construction of a flight rehabilitation cage at the California Raptor Center (UC Davis)

Camp Cody, located in the Sierra Nevada along the shore of Cody Lake (7,260 feet altitude), has been the home of Troop One's week-long summer camp since 1937. It is one of the few troop-owned camps in the Golden Empire Council and the Western Region.

- Camp Cody has earned full BSA National Resident Camp Certification continuously since 2007
- Camp Cody is widely recognized as "The Best Backwoods Camp in the Sierras"
- The camp has no roads, no electricity, and no beds. Scouts hike in all the camp's food, fuel, and equipment down into camp on foot. Troop One Scouts, families, and alumni help set up and take down camp each year
- Camp Cody offers 27 merit badges, along with the opportunity to earn BSA Lifeguard and the Mile Swim award
- The camp staff is all volunteer, comprising current older Scouts, troop parents, and alumni. Many of the adults who volunteer attended Cody as Troop One Scouts or parents, and some have volunteered there for decades



While preparing for this 100th anniversary event, a few of us had the chance to interview 17 Troop One alumni from across the decades. During one of these interviews, Josh Walters, a Daniel Boone Patrol alumnus and Sacramento-based account executive,

made an important observation: "While earning the Eagle Scout rank is a goal of Scouting, it is by no means the **only** goal of Scouting." I couldn't agree more.

Every boy who's passed through Troop One in the last century benefited from a belief shared by the troop's founders. In 1916, the troop's adults understood that young men would be more well-rounded, resourceful, and compassionate citizens as a result of being in Scouting. As the years passed, dozens more adult volunteers and alumni saw the enormous value of empowering young men to learn outdoor skills and lead others, and did what they could to help make this boy-led troop a reality. It was that shared belief that helped enable so many Scouts to achieve so much over the last century.

Although we can quantify much about the troop's history, it becomes tougher to calculate Troop One's most enduring impressions. What value can be assigned to a Scout's respect for nature? An inclination to serve others? A working knowledge of first aid and wilderness survival? Memories of countless weekend camping trips, hiking along coastal bluffs or trekking through dense forests? Recollections of afternoons gliding across Cody Lake on a sailboat or canoe, or marveling at thousands of stars at night in the mountains? How does one measure the value of friendships that are forged on a trail or around propane stoves, especially when those friendships endure long after camp and the outings are over?

Truly, the value of such experiences is beyond measure... and leave those who participated better prepared for all the trails ahead.
