The Signs, Signals and Codes Merit Badge covers several types of communication other than verbal. Some of these forms of communication are used in everyday work situations and others are rarely used anymore but are important to know if regular means of communications cannot be used.

Pre-Camp Work

Review the Signs, Signals and Codes Merit book.

Become familiar with the types of communication that are discussed. It is impossible to become an expert in all of the forms of communications that are presented but becoming familiar with them will make the completion of the merit badge easier.

The Braille Alphabet and Numbers will be the most difficult to master. You do not need to be an expert but do take the time to review the Braille Supplement in the merit badge pamphlet.
